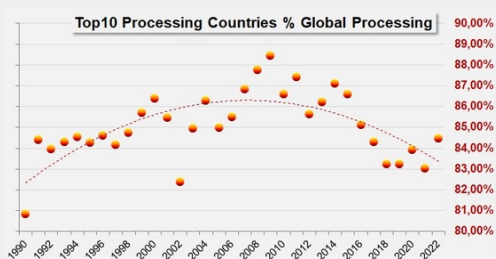




Climate change may alter the future of the processing tomato industry

Ketchup and other tomato products, stalwarts of many meals, may soon be a much rarer commodity as climate change threatens to halve the fruit's global harvest this century, according to a new study. In the worst-case scenario, between 2050 and 2100, the tomato harvest could be halved.

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TOP10 processing countries: once more on the upswing

Based on current global processing forecasts (see our article WPTC Crop update as of 1 July 2022), the overall operations of the top ten processing countries (32.47 million metric tonnes (mT)) are expected to account in 2022 for just under 84.5% of the total global quantities forecast (38.44 million mT).

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
